OHCHR-Nepal hands over materials to Tribhuvan University Library

As part of OHCHR-Nepal's ongoing capacity building activities, Richard Bennett, Representative of the UN High Commissioner for Human Rights, on Tuesday handed over resource materials to Mr. Krishna Mani Bhandary, Librarian of the Tribhuvan University Central Library (TUCL).

In a ceremony at TUCL premises, the Representative handed over more than 100 books on human rights, OHCHR publications, including human rights fact-sheets, manuals, guidelines, informative brochures and promotional audio-visual materials, and reports published by OHCHR-Nepal. The handover ceremony was followed by a training session for Library officials on fundamentals of human rights, OHCHR-Nepal's mandate and an introduction to on-line resources on human rights, including the OHCHR website.

Established in 1959, TUCL has been the official UN repository in Nepal since 1964. One of the largest libraries in Nepal, it has about 12,000 members and is visited by 1,500 users daily. The UN has plans to make resource materials available to other universities so that repositories can be established in other regions of Nepal.
